You are about to take the 2022 USA Biology Olympiad (USABO) Open Exam, the first exam in a series of exams to qualify students for the International Biology Olympiad (IBO). *Please complete as much of this multiple-choice exam as you can.* The fact that you are taking this exam indicates that you are an outstanding biology student. Students scoring in the top 10% on this exam will be invited to take the USABO Semifinal Exam on March 31, 2022. The top 20 students from the Semifinal Exam will be selected to attend the USABO National Finals. From the National Finals, four students will represent the United States at the International Biology (IBO) at the Yerevan, Armenia from July 10 to 18, 2022.
